Second day (21st Aug. 2013)

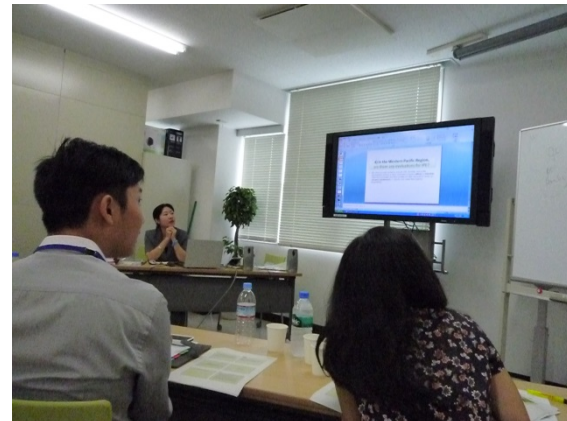
Lecture

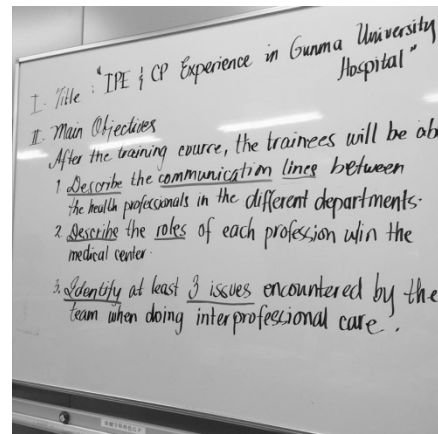
Presentation by JIPWEN universities (2)
